first author, his research findings in the microbiology lab of Howard Xu were submitted to the Journal of Clinical Microbiology for publication. This paper is titled "Phenotypic and Molecular Characterization of Acinetobacter baumannii Clinical Outbreak Isolates from Los Angeles County Hospitals".

Wayne has participated in research outside of Cal State L.A. and credits his mentor, Momand, and the MORE programs for helping make this possible. For two summers, Wayne participated in cancer research at St. Jude Children's Research Hospital in Memphis, Tenn., and the Cancer Institute of New Jersey.

Wavne has been accepted by Harvard Medical School to spend 10 weeks next summer looking at the role of the PI3K pathway in cancer and ways to therapeutically reduce the cancer burden it triggers.
