

Program Overview

Provides specialist training in crime scene investigation & friction ridge examination

Two cohorts per year.

Program courses combine two tracks:

Crime Scene Investigation

Friction Ridge Examination

All course instructors are forensic specialists affiliated with a law enforcement agency in southern CA.

The instructors are courtqualified in friction ridge examination and crime scene investigation

What is the cost of attendance?

\$4500 (includes all required lecture, laboratory and fieldwork supplies)

When are program fees due?

January 2025: Oct 1 (\$750 non-refundable deposit), Dec 1 (\$1250), Feb 1 (\$1250), April 1 (\$1250) June 2025 Cohort: Jan 1 (\$750 non-refundable deposit); March 1 (\$1250); June 1 (\$1250); Sept 1 (\$1250)

Does the program course schedule accommodate working professionals?

Yes, the courses in the Fingerprint Track are offered Friday (evening), Saturday, Sunday. The courses in the CSI Track are offered Saturday and Sunday.

What degree is acceptable in order to be eligible for admission to the program?

Applicants must hold an associate degree or must be currently enrolled in an associate degree program

What is the average class size for the courses?

All courses are in-person and a typical cohort consists of no more than 24 students

Who are the course instructors?

Court-qualified Forensic Specialist practitioners employed by a large law enforcement agency based in southern California. Each course (other than the basic photography course) will include two instructors.

What certificate is earned after completing the program?

Students earn a Forensic Specialist certificate.

What employment opportunities are related to the program?

There are several entry-level positions offered by law enforcement agencies. Job titles vary by agency and include: Forensic Specialist, Forensic Identification Specialist, Crime Scene Specialist, Photographer, Forensic Print Specialist, Crime Scene Investigator.

- 6. Mock Crime Scene Practicums and Courtroom Testimony (40 hrs)

II. Friction Ridge Examination Track

- 7. Introduction to Friction Ridge Analysis (40 hrs)
- 8. Friction Ridge Examination Process (40 hrs)
- 9. Courtroom Testimony and Report Writing for Friction Ridge Examination (40 hrs)

The program is administered by the California Forensic Science Institute. All courses are held in university classrooms and laboratories within the Hertzberg-Davis Forensic Science Center on the campus of California State University, Los Angeles. A student daily parking pass may be purchased for use in the adjacent lot (Parking Lot A).
