## Author's Note

Three years ago, if you had told me I was going to write and perform a show about obesity as my MFA culminating project...I probably wouldn't have believed you. As a nearly life-long obese person my body has always been the elephant in the room that I was too afraid to face. For many reasons, some which you'll see in our show, obese people often have complex relationships with their bodies and society. Mine has too often been one of fear and shame. A life lived in the liminal space between being both too much and not enough.

So, three years ago the idea that someone who looked like me could even get into graduate school and have an MFA project to complete seemed a little bit like fantasy. Three years ago, the idea of *choosing* to talk about my greatest source of personal fear and shame through my work as an artist would have seemed terrifying. Three years ago, I might have seen this script as destroying me by pulling away my façade to expose the truth. But three years ago, I would have been wrong. In exposing truth and fully embracing one's self, even in one's weakness, one may find power.

This is acting.

I wrote this script, not only to begin to understand my own relationship with my body and challenge audiences to reexamine their bias against overweight people, but also to create representation for other overweight and obese people through performance. Our stories matter. We matter. And we are enough. On my first day of graduate school orientation one of my now-culminating project committee members told my cohort that to name what one is afraid of is to have power over it, and perhaps to fear it a bit less. So, with this script I name my body, my obesity, and my fatness. And through this performance I take a step, from fat toward free.
