2. 2.1 Senator Harris raised a concern that the Outstanding Lecturer Award policy in the Faculty Handbook refers to "quarters" and not "terms" or "semesters."

2.2 Chair Prabhu advised that a task force is currently working on policy revisions, which will be divided into three categories – editorial, substantive, and warrants deletion. The policies categorized under the latter two will be brought to the Senate floor.

3. Senator Porter raised the following concern on behalf of a colleague: It has come to my attention that ITS has modified the firewall to limit access to campus-based web sites to domestic IP addresses. Was this new policy discussed with faculty? What campus web sites are affected? Will there be a mechanism to ensure that faculty are not taken by surprise? A faculty (and it can be assumed that more faculty is affected), who offers a highly popular web-based science education simulations (ScienceCourseware.org) that is based on campus, has been inundated with complaints from outside the U.S. that our web site is down and they cannot access the site for their instruction.

10.2 Debate ensued.
10.3 The Bezdecny motion was APPROVED. (V: 25/9)
10.4 It was m/s/ (Brooks) to delete from line 173 FOUR before UNDERGRADUATES and insert "AT LEAST" after AND.
10.5 Senator Riggio suggested inserting "STUDENTS" after GRADUATES. No objections were raised.
10.6 Debate ensued.
10.7 The Brooks motion failed. (V: 15/18)
10.8 It was m/s/ (Romero) to amend line 173 to read THREE UNDERGRADUATES, TWO GRADUATES, AND ONE AT-LARGE.
10.9 Debate ensued and Senator Harris called the question. No objections were raised.
10.10 The Romero motion was APPROVED. (V: 22/10)
10.11 Senator Baaske raised a point of order: The Romero motion has to also amend line 235. No objections were raised.
10.12 Senator Harris suggested an editorial amendment to add STUDENTS after "undergraduate" and "graduate" wherever its exists in the document. No objections were raised.
10.13 The recommendation was APPROVED. (V: 24/3)

- 10.14 Chair Prabhu reminded the body that two Senators are needed to draft a pro and a con. Senator Baaske volunteered to draft the pro statement and Senator Harris volunteered to draft the con statement. No objections were raised .
- 10.15 Chair Prabhu advised the body that the statements will be presented at the next meeting, but Senators could email the authors of the statements to provide input to the draft.

- 11.5 It was m/s/ (Harris) to delete from line 9 WHO TEACH USING DIFFERENT INSTRUCTION MODES, and insert MAY SCHEDULE OFFICE HOURS CONSISTENT WITH THEIR MODE OF INSTRUCTION after "MEMBERS" and delete from lines 10-11 SHALL SCHEDULE OFFICE HOURS CONSISTENT WITH THE MODE OF INSTRUCTION.
