3. 3.1 Chair Prabhu reported the response from Provost Mahoney to the concern raised by
Senator Heubach at the Senate meeting of March 12, 2019 (ASM 18-12):
Dear Academic Senate:
I thank Senator Silvia Heubach for raising the question on behalf of Beth Baker-
Cristales. My answer follows.
First of all, let me clarify the information surrounding this inquiry. It is accurate that
our official transcript only lists a cumulative GPA. However, this is also true of our
unofficial transcript in GET. And while it might be the impression that our
institutional GPAs are always higher, this is not actually the case. Currently in the
College of NSS, 51 percent of the undergraduates has the same institutional and
cumulative GPA, 23 percent has a higher institutional GPA and 26 percent has a
lower institutional GPA.
It is also important to understand the difference in the UC Transfer Credit Policy.
While UCs allow transfer work from Community Colleges or CSUs to meet degree

requirements, they do not allow the grades earned to be counted towards any GPA. So for UCs the only time the institutional and cumulative GPA would be different is if they had transfer coursework from other UCs or their education abroad program. CSU policy requires all transfer credit to be counted in the cumulative GPA.

Finally, the ability to display the institutional GPA is not currently supported by our vendor. We are planning to move our transcript production to a different technology in the future. We are happy to consult with the appropriate senate committees at that time on the pros and cons of making this change. In the meantime, it is our experience with graduate programs that a much more comprehensive review is completed, which rarely uses cumulative GPA's in a meaningful manner.

3.2 Chair Prabhu reported the response from VP Chavez to the concern raised by Senator Talcott at the Senate meeting of March 12, 2019 (ASM 18-12):

We first consult with Academic Affairs and the President, who, in turn, consult with their reports. Once we have a date, that has been approved by the President and the Provost we send out an email notification to all of the Deans, Associate Deans and Department Chairs to advise them so that they can notice their faculty far enough in advance to make accommodations or adjustments on their class schedules. That notice was sent out on December 5, 2018 for today's (March 13, 2019) evacuation drill. In addition, the Emergency Management Advisory Committee, on which the Academic Senate has a designee, is also advised and meets on a quarterly basis. We have attempted to be as consultative as possible and would welcome any constructive suggestions.
