### NOTES FOR GENERAL EDUCATION LOWER DIVISION COURSES

- GE requirements must add up to at least 48 semester units. (39 Lower Division, 9 Upper Division units)
- An Introduction to Higher Education course (IHE) is required of all first-time freshmen.
- A minimum C- grade in A1, A2, A3, and B4 classes is required.
- A minimum C grade average in general education is required.

#### University Requirements:

- Civic Learning/Community Engagement requirement (6 semester units). One (cl) course is met by ENGR 1500 and the other must be completed at the upper division general education level. These courses are designated as (cl) after the course listing.
- Diversity requirement (6 semester units). Students must complete one race/ethnicity (re) course and one diversity (d) course, or another race/ethnicity (re) course. These courses are designated as (re) and (d) after the course listing.
- Writing Intensive Requirement (3 semester units). Students must complete one writing intensive (wi) course in their major. These courses are designated as (wi) after the course listing.

#### \*Cross-listed Courses

Cross-listed courses are regular and or GE courses offered by multiple departments with the same content. Please refer to the course catalog to check if a course is cross-listed.
