 professionals in public health and social/behavioral sciences
- ✓ Interested in learning about career opportunities in cancer disparities (research, education, outreach)
- ✓ In good academic standing (minimum "B" average)

Those communities who experience an excess or unknown burden of cancer and who are underrepresented in the field of cancer disparities research.

Three Components of the Program:

- "Careers in Cancer Disparities Research" 5-Day Summer Institute
 Decide if a doctoral program is right for you; acquire the tools needed to apply
- Paid Internships (Optional)
 Intern with cancer disparities researchers from prestigious California universities
- Doctoral Application Support Awards
 Become eligible for awards up to \$2,000 for doctoral application expenses
