Valentina Kulagina, the wife of Gustav Klutssis, collaborated with her husband to create propaganda art that supported Stalin's regime. Kulagina portrayed women as skilled workers vital for the Soviet Union's industrial development. The art advocated for women to leave home and work in factories. Although Kulagina and Klutssis supported Stalin's agenda, they did not escape his persecution. Klutssis was secretly executed. Kulagina did not learn about her husband's fate before dying in 1987.
